ENROLLMENT RELATED INFORMATION*

The information in this section represents a more detailed look at enrollment at The University of Mississippi. Enrollments for the Oxford Campus, Medical Center, and off-campus centers are included.

Highlights:

- 1) The combined enrollment of The University of Mississippi (Oxford Campus, Medical Center, and off-campus) increased to an all time high of 14,429, an increase of 4% over Fall 2000. Enrollment on the Oxford Campus increased by 468 students to 11,873. The DeSoto Center increased enrollment 14% (from 356 students to 405), the Tupelo Regional Campus increased by 25% (from 285 students to 326), Special Classes increased 3% (from 142 students to 146), and the Medical Center enrollment decreased 2% (from 1,694 students to 1,658).
- 2) Undergraduate enrollment increased to 9,891 students. The College of Liberal Arts and the Schools of Business Administration, and Pharmacy showed an increase in undergraduate enrollment.
- 3) Law School enrollment increased slightly by 6 students to a total of 478 students. Nonresident law student enrollment decreased 14% (from 94 students to 81).
- 4) Enrollment of African-American students increased 7% to 1,485. The proportion of African-American students enrolled at The University of Mississippi is 12.5%.
- 5) Retention patterns at the University remained stable and are comparable to other institutions. The graduation rate after six years for the entering class of Fall 1995 was 50%.
